Alliant International University is proud to educate students for careers in professional practice.

Data on graduate employment and success is collected in a variety of ways including

- Surveys post-graduation from the career planning office or the program office;
- Federal or State public employment databases;
- State licensure information;
- Internet searches; and
- Information sent in by graduates.

Some of Alliant’s programs require licensure, credentials or certification; thus Alliant monitors the degree to which graduates receive the licensure appropriate to their professional career fields.

Summary information available on careers and employment at Alliant is below. Some additional information on licensure and credentialing is found on Alliant’s program or Higher Education Opportunity Act web page.

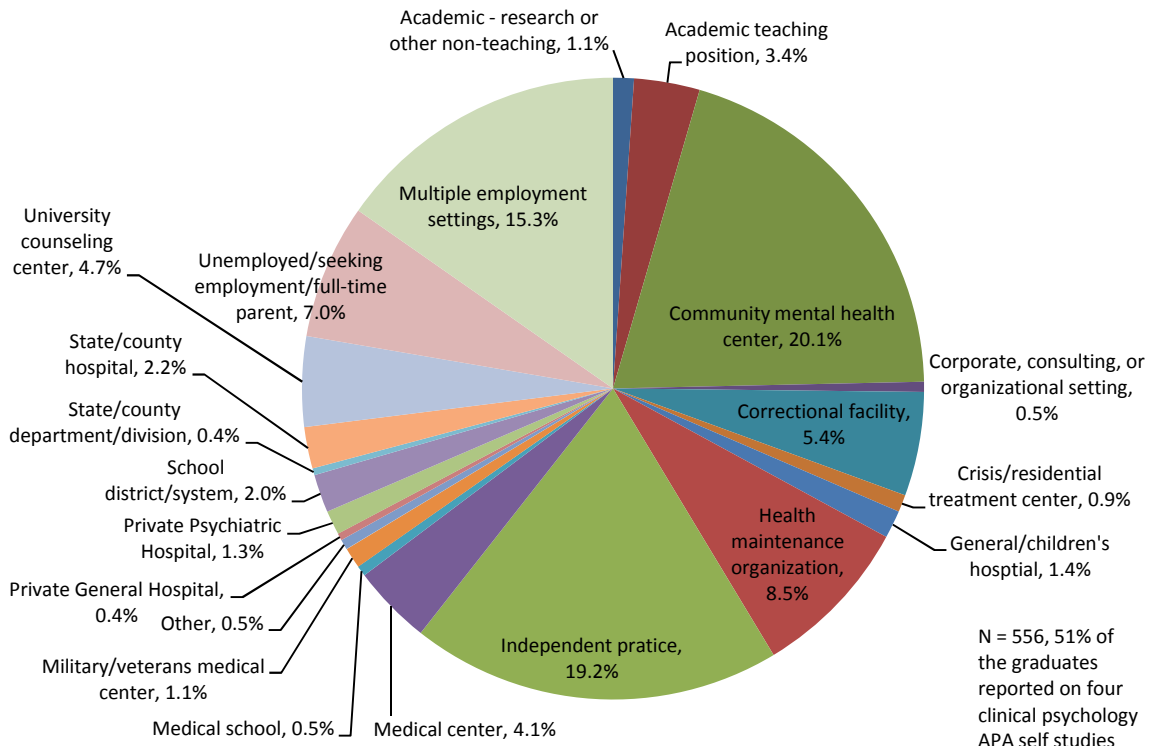
Graduate Programs – California School of Professional Psychology

Clinical Psychologist Employment Settings PhD and PsyD Programs



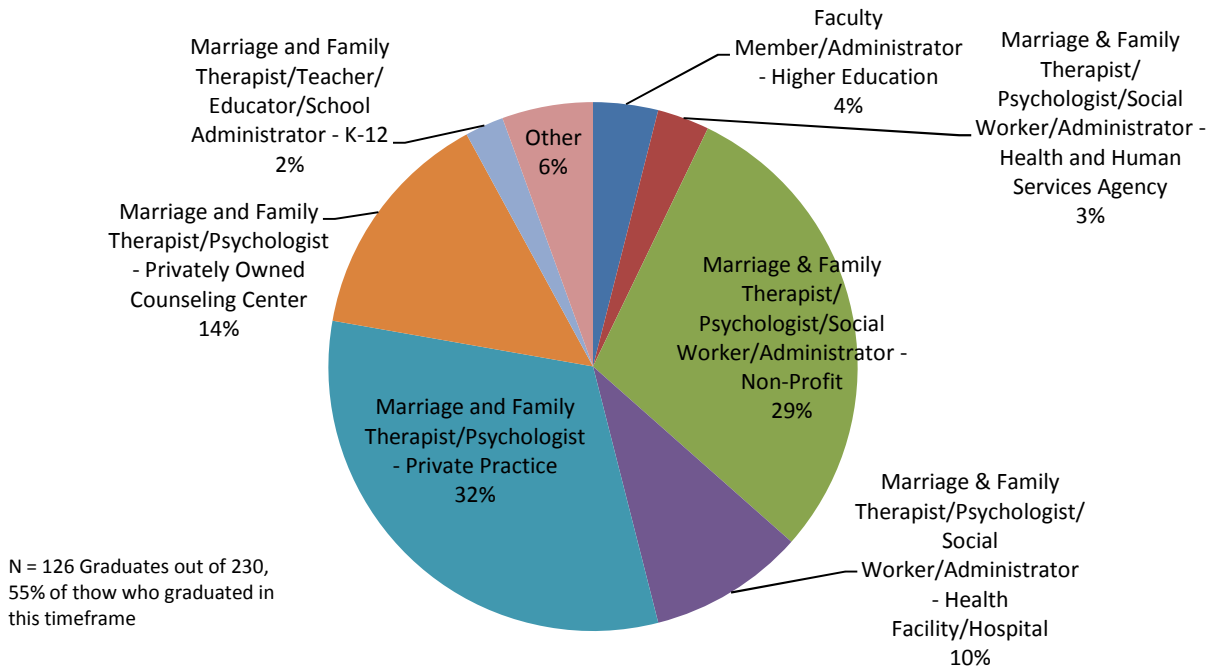

Methodology: Information on graduates was obtained from state licensing boards sites, public federal and state employment databases, and the internet in June 2010. Please note: This information includes both MFT Master’s and Psychology (PSYD) Graduates. Some of the MFT Master’s graduates are currently enrolled in the PsyD program. Students enrolled in the PsyD program who have earned a MFT Master’s, during their program, have been included for this purpose, even if they are still enrolled in the program. Students who obtained a license can either have a MFT or Psychology license.

Graduate Programs – Hufstedler School of Education

Graduates of the Hufstedler School of Education serve their communities in professional practice roles in a variety of education and related settings.

Teacher Education Programs

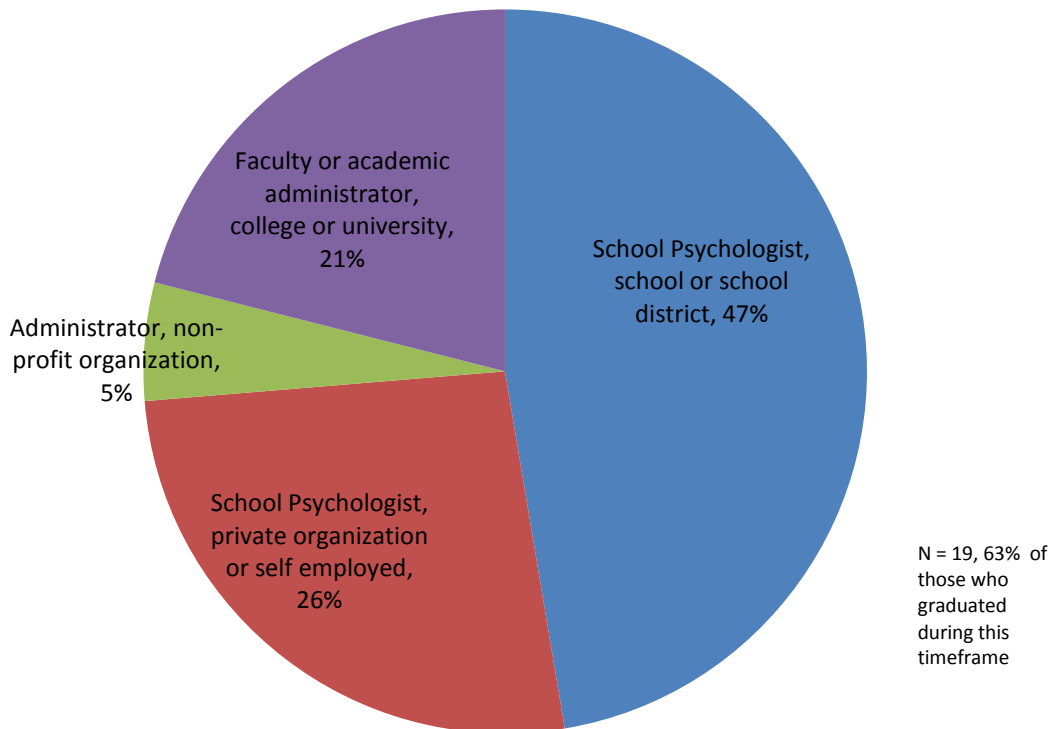
Alliant offers teacher credential and master's in education programs. Usually the master's program is 9-15 units in more than the teaching credential. Approximately 93% of students enter Alliant's Early Completion Option or Standard Intern programs, in which students enter the program hired as a K-12 teacher or special education teacher within a school district. Thus, 93% are already employed in their profession during their education. Seven percent (7%) enter student teaching programs in which they take coursework and do a student teaching internship, then seek employment.

School Psychology Programs

Master's level/credential and employment, 90% received their PPS credential after the completion of their Master of Arts in Education: School Psychology program at Alliant and 4% worked with another teaching credential (e.g., teaching credential or substitute teacher credential). The remaining 6% have not completed a credential. Of those whose current employment situation is known, 62% are working as school or educational psychologists, 17% are working as other types of mental health, child, or behavioral counselors, and 21% continued their education at the doctoral level at Alliant.

Employment Positions, PsyD in Educational Psychology Graduates 7/1/2005-12/30/2009

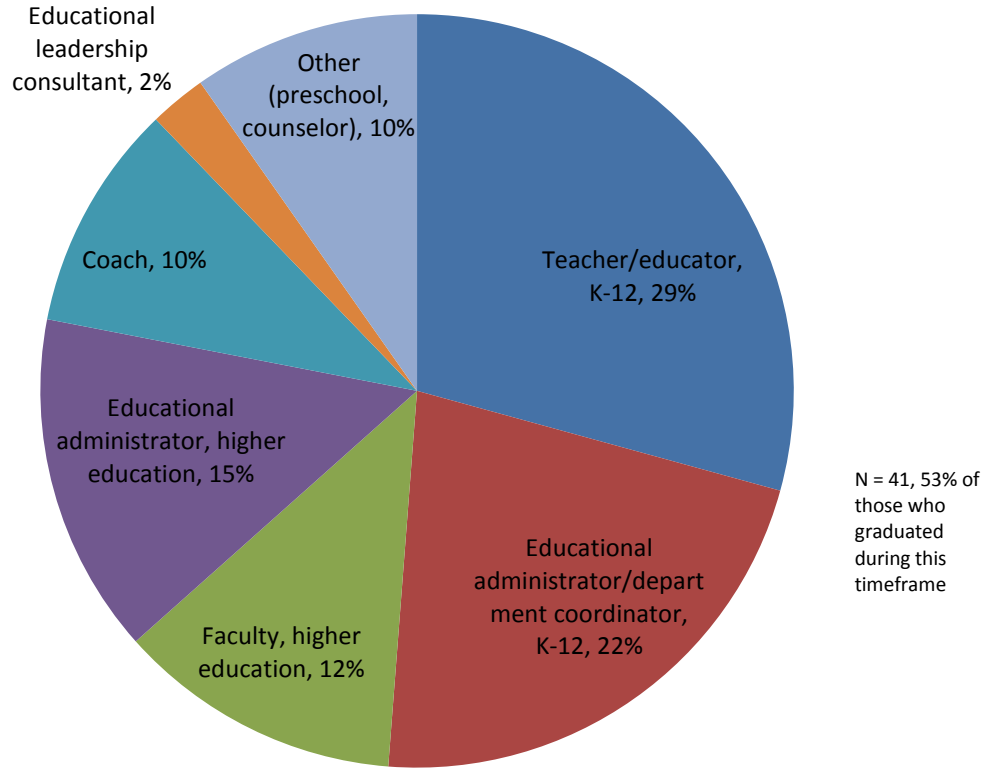

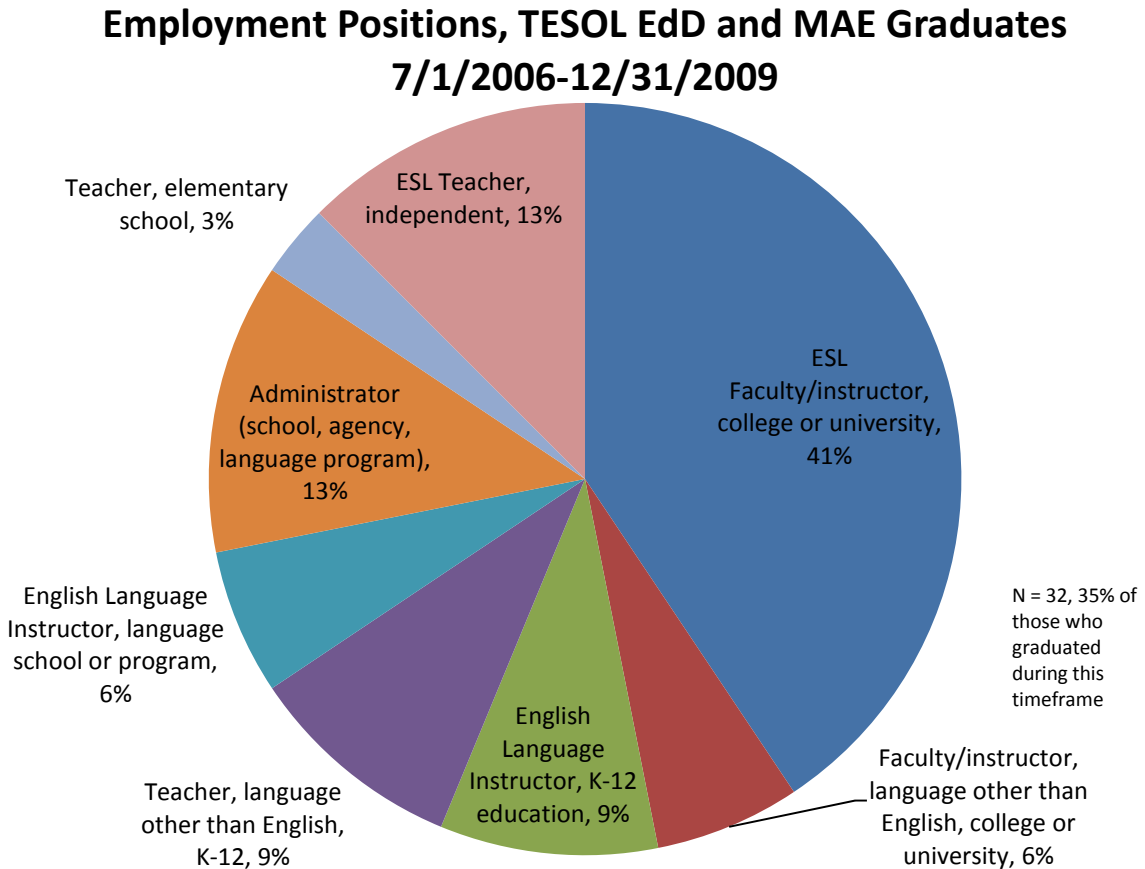
Educational Leadership EdD and Educational Administration MAE Graduates, 6/1/2006-12/31/2009

Students graduating with the CTCL Certificate are teachers who are required to obtain that certificate to continue their employment.

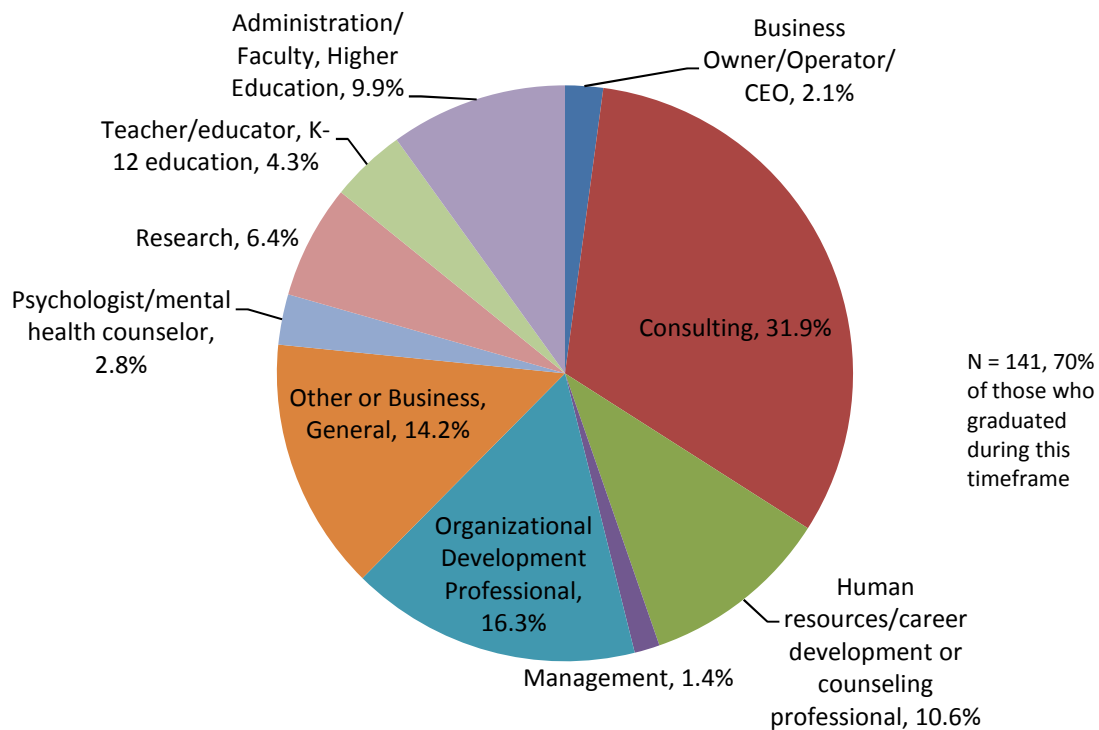
Graduate Programs – Marshall Goldsmith School of Management

Employment Positions, Industrial and Organizational Graduates, 7/1/2005-4/30/2010

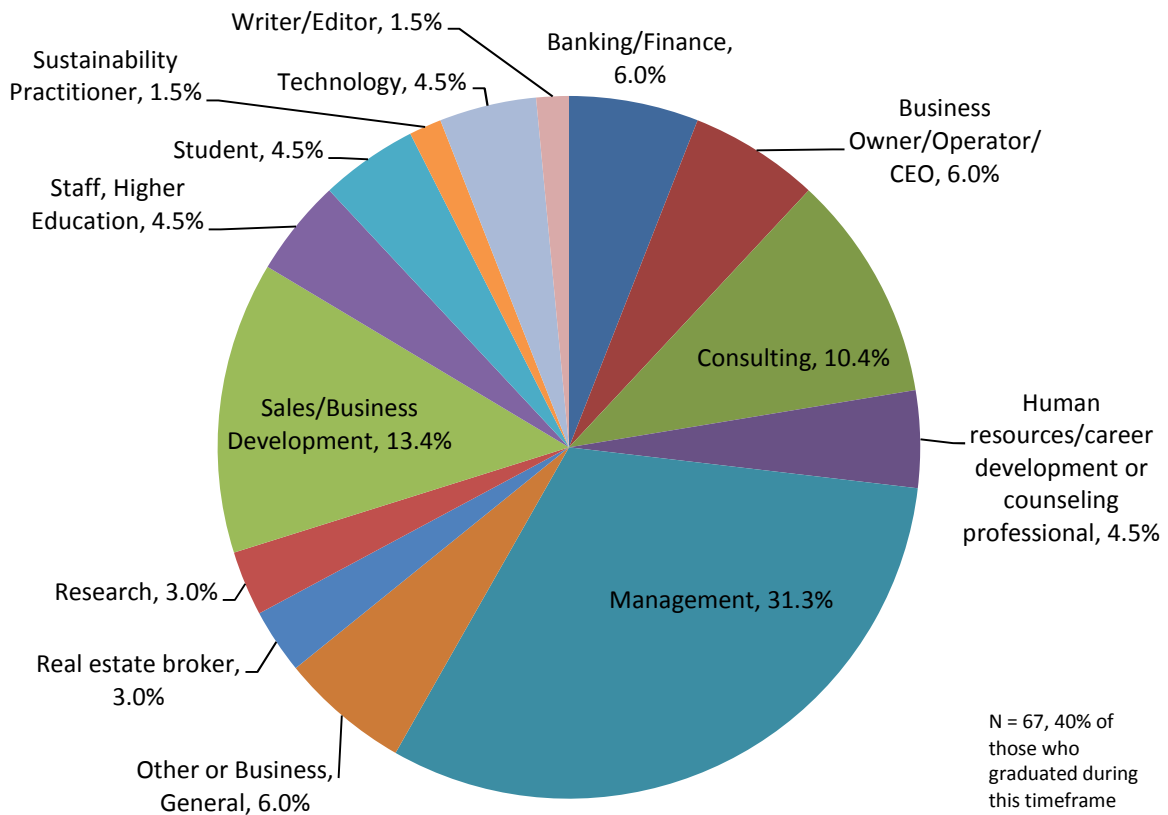

Employment Positions, MBA/MIBA Graduates 7/1/2005-12/31/2009

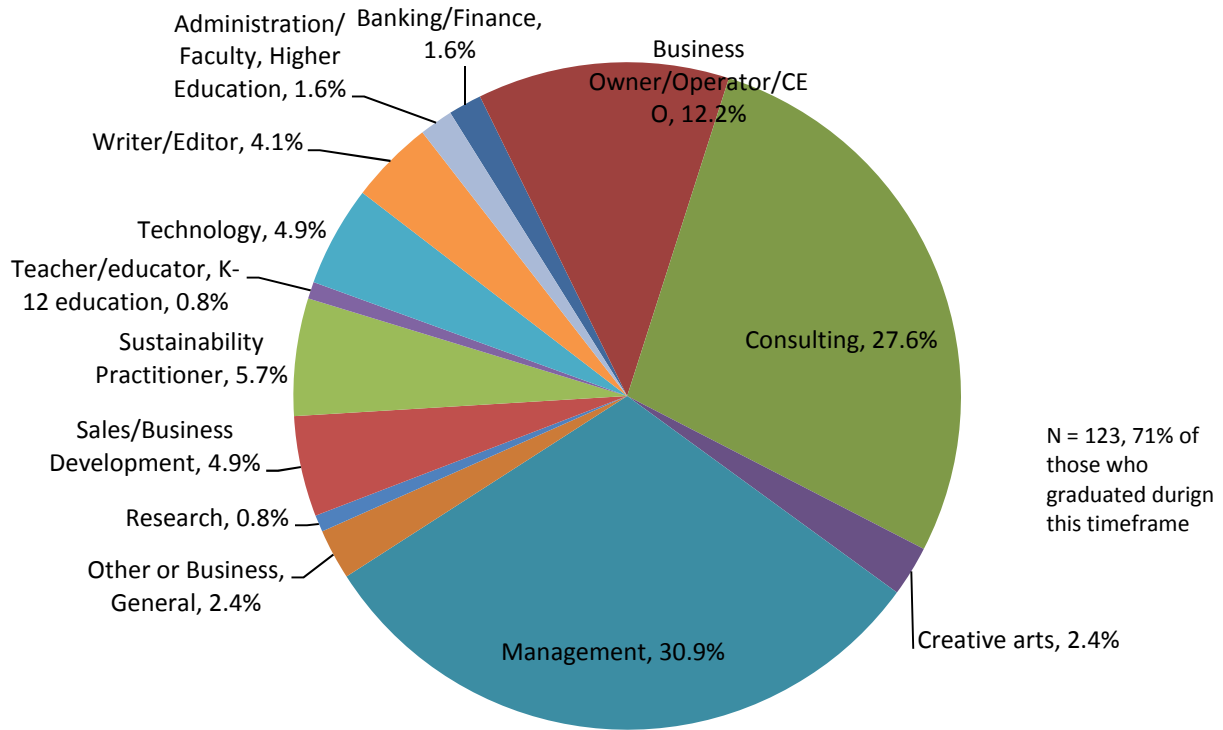

7/1/2005-12/31/2009**

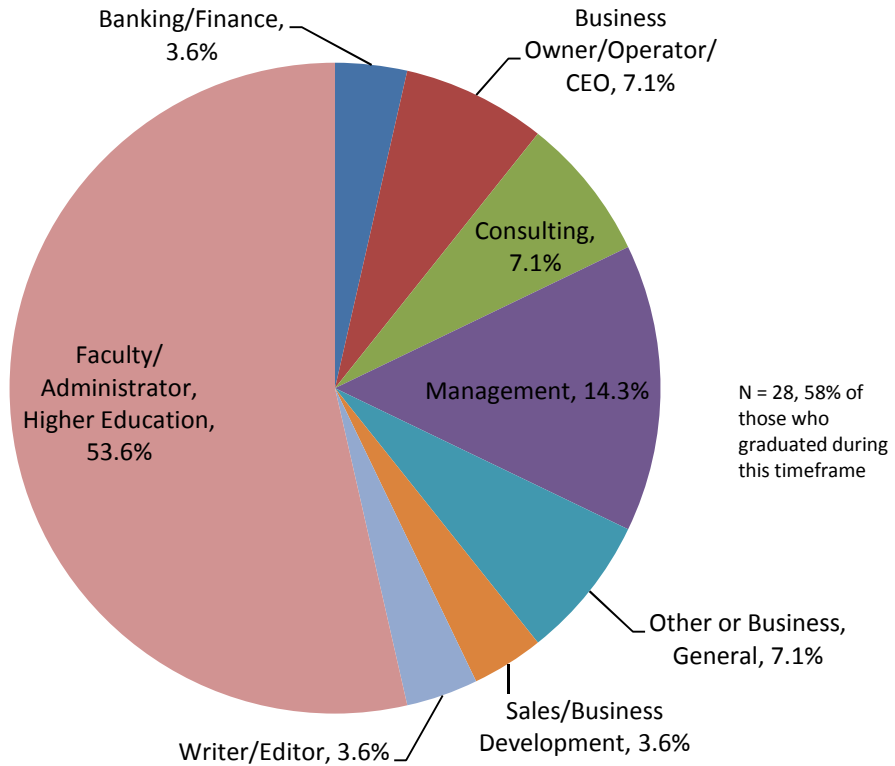

Employment Positions, DBA Graduates 7/1/2005-12/31/2009

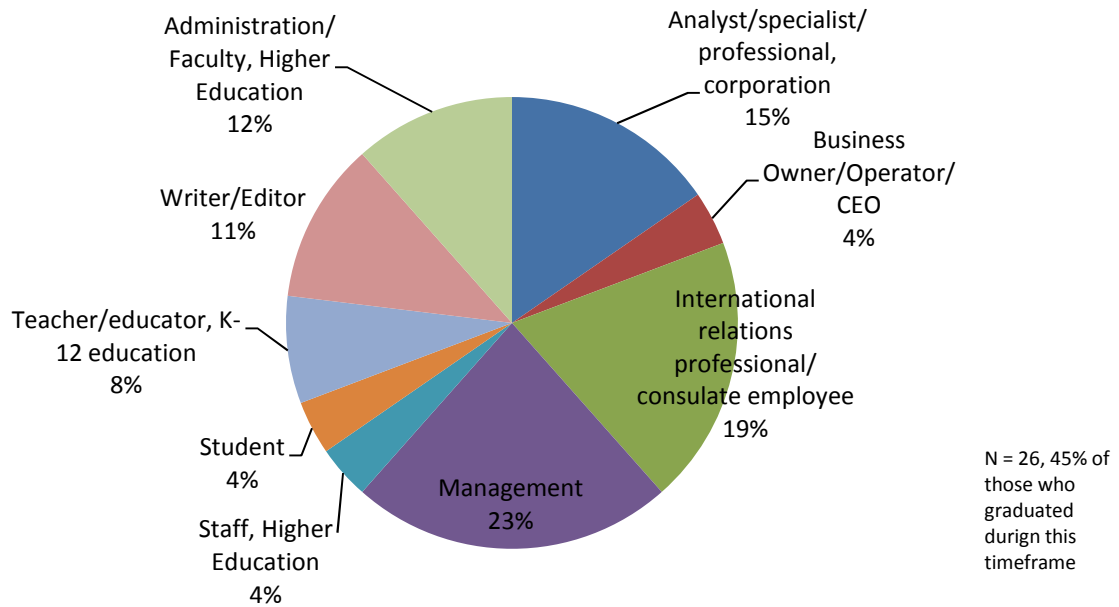

7/1/2005-12/31/2009**

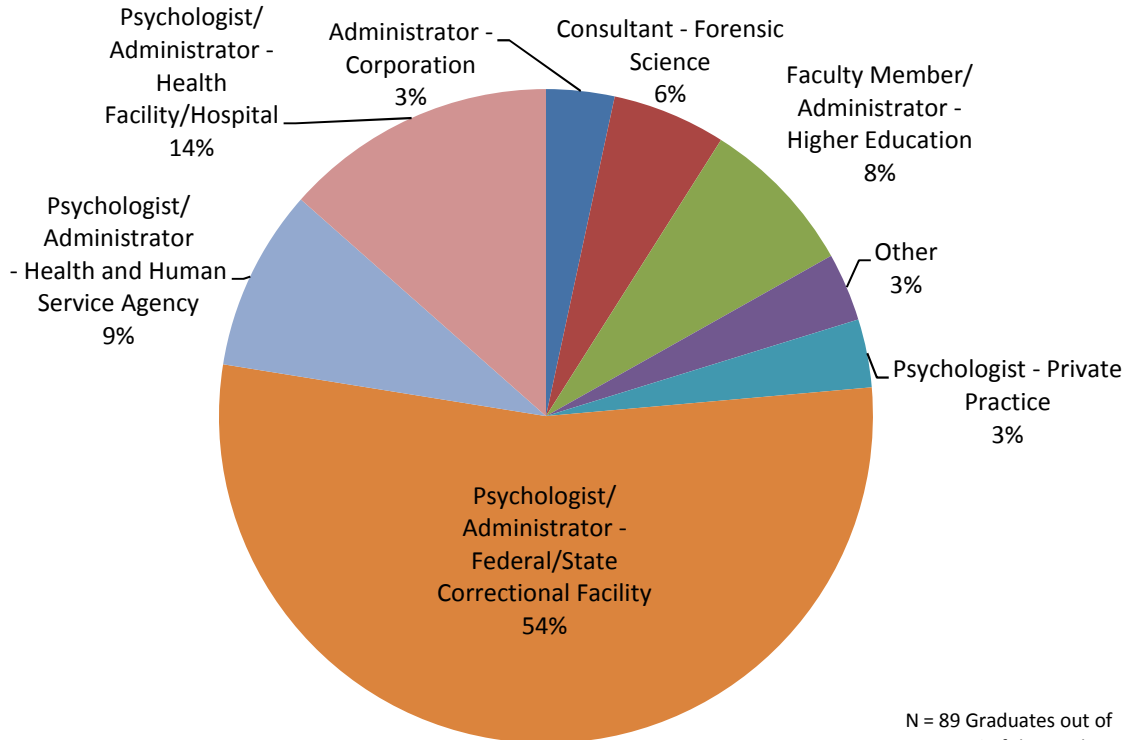

Graduate Programs – California School of Forensic Studies

The California School of Forensic Studies educates student for professional practice positions related to forensic studies.

N = 89 Graduates out of 113, 79% of those who graduated during this timeframe

Licensure is required for most types of practice as a psychologist, but it is not required in correctional settings or to be faculty members in an academic setting. Licensure rates of those who have graduated from the program and have had 2 years required to obtain their license (obtaining post-doctoral hours and passing the licensing exam) are below.

The licensure rate for PsyD graduates is greater than that of PhD graduates as some PhD graduates are not enrolled in a licensure-track program.

Methodology: Information on graduates was obtained from state licensing boards sites, public federal and state employment databases, and the internet in June 2010.

Undergraduate Programs

Alliant alumni from the undergraduate programs have earned a BA or BA degree. Some continue their education immediately, while others enter careers in a variety of settings.

Of the 86 undergraduate students who graduated from Alliant from 7/1/2008-1/1/2009, Alliant has information on 47% of the graduates. Of these 40 students,

- 24 are in graduate school, and
- 16 are employed.

Those who are employed, the majority are in the corporate sector.

- 2 are self employed business owners or consultants
- 9 are in sales, marketing, public relations/communications, hospitality or account management
- 3 are managers of services or operations
- 2 are in business, title unknown
